Easter Offering 2023

This year's Easter Offering continues our tradition to give it all away for the benefit of others in our community and beyond. We will share the offering with these four groups or agencies.

For more than 100 years <u>Red Bird Missions</u> has been helping the people of the Appalachian mountain area. The Mission has a K-12 Christian school, dental and medical clinics, job training, parenting classes, senior citizen programs, kids sports teams, food distribution, day care and many other programs. The Mission has been a lifeline for the people of these rural communities who struggle to improve their lives. **Red Bird Mission** will receive a part of our Easter offering.

The new <u>Chacocente Scholars' Program</u> will receive help from us. For years we have made donations to Project Chacocente, the program that helped people who lived in the Managua City Dump (Nicaragua) relocate to a community built on nearby farmland. Farming techniques were taught, buildings constructed and a school was created. Unfortunately, two years ago the Nicaraguan government took over the community school, equipment, farmland and well, and we could no longer donate money to the Chacocente community. However, the school has recently reopened under government control. A new program has been created by people who formerly worked with the Chacocente community to support scholars directly. By donating to this new program, we can provide children with school supplies, uniforms, shoes, school registration and tuition fees, and transportation. Adult scholars can receive funds to cover vocational training or college tuition and supplies. All of these expenses are nominal but have a huge impact on the lives of the scholars. With this new program, we can continue to help these people who are trying to improve their lives.

<u>The Guardian House</u>, the shelter for homeless women veterans, will receive a donation. They are planning to expand their facility by building two duplexes on their property. This new housing will be for homeless women veterans and their children. Because there will be children living there, our church has agreed to work with the Presbyterian New England Church of Saratoga to raise money and help build a playground.

Money will also be shared with the local food pantries we continue to support including **Schenectady Community Ministries and Life Works Community Action** in Ballston Spa.


SUMMER CAMP REGISTRATION IS OPEN



Special Session of the Upper New York Conference — March 25, 2023

Your representatives (Libby Horn, Holly Rogers, Pastor Amy, and Pastor Brendan) attended the Zoom meeting on Saturday 3/25. This was the first session led by our new Bishop Hector. The purpose of the meeting was to present and vote on the Requests for Disaffiliation by 18 churches in our Conference. As part of the presentation, it was explained that each congregation has completed a period of discernment, had a church conference when at least 2/3 majority voted for disaffiliation and paid to the conference their pension liability and 12 months of ministry shares. Church property ownership will stay with the individual churches as per agreement with the Conference. Details of Global Methodist affiliation or independence were not shared as part of these resolutions, but could be requested of individual churches.

In year 2022 the Schenectady NY area collective efforts for CROP raised over \$36,000, 25% of which was used locally and 75% which was used for global projects through Church World Service. CWS is currently working in Moldova, Ukraine; Afghanistan; Jackson, Mississippi, Pakistan in conjunction with World Service Asia, and in Turkey with Middle East Council of Churches and UMCOR. Of particular interest to us here in BHUMC, CROP is currently helping Kenyan farmers who live in areas flooded due to climate change by suspending bee hive boxes on overhead supports. The bees and their honey combs now provide income and nutrition to those farming families! Please join our walkers on May 2 and make a donation.
