A Spiritual Journey

by Wendell Berry from The Collected Poems of Wendell Berry, 1957-1982

And the world cannot be discovered by a journey of miles, no matter how long, but only by a spiritual journey, a journey of one inch, very arduous and humbling and joyful, by which we arrive at the ground at our feet, and learn to be at home.

Have you ever noticed that we use the word **journey** a lot in church but almost never in daily life? We go on a trip or adventure, we travel somewhere but almost never go on a journey. That's for ancient explorers, fairy tales and epic stories. A journey implies a quest, an ordeal, a difficult search for a goal of great importance. If given a choice I'd much rather just go to the grocery store than journey to the grocery store—that sounds too arduous for milk and bread!

But seeing the life of the Spirit as a journey is a part of our and many other spiritual traditions. A pilgrimage is a special journey to a sacred place, be it the Hajj journey that our Muslim friends make or a trip to the Holy Land to walk in the footsteps of Jesus and our spiritual ancestors. Right here in Burnt Hills, we journey to Bethlehem and the manger during Advent. We journey with Jesus to Jerusalem during Lent and especially during his final days during Holy Week to the empty tomb and Resurrection. After Easter we go on the journey as the Spirit goes out into all parts of the world.

This Lent we are going to spend some time looking at our spiritual journey as an image—in a sandbox. Yes, you did read that correctly! In the sanctuary we have a square box of sand on a table that is ready to receive our contemplations in sand this season. You are invited to bring something small to add to the box as we depict our Lenten journey in the sand. Perhaps it is something from nature that you've picked up on a walk or hike. Perhaps it is something you've made. Maybe it is an object that has significance for you in your faith. We will have available pieces of terra cotta clay that air harden in a few days if you'd like to make something for the box.

Do you have questions about this creative tool for contemplation?

But, what is it exactly that we are making—what should it look like when we are finished?

• There are no directions for assembly! We don't know that yet. It will unfold with us as we undertake our journey together through Lent.

How will all of our individual journeys come together to depict our journey as a church? What if mine doesn't seem to go with the others?

• This Lent, as our overarching theme we are exploring kinship in a world of relationships. So, what better time to bring all of our parts and journeys, and put them together to contemplate the connections and relationships. We are the body of Christ, after all. And all the parts can't be the same—that would be a strange body indeed!

Will I be able to get back the things I bring in?

• After Easter, you can take home with you the objects you bring in. Just remember the church is open so don't bring in something that would break your heart to lose!

So this Lent, let's **spend some time thinking about our Lenten journey.** Bring something once—or every week or not at all.

Touch the sand, play with it or take a curious peek at what is being created. All ages are welcome to participate.

There will be some objects to choose from available every week. See if something there moves you to add it to our box. It's all ok! Let's take the time to play, be creative and to contemplate important points on our path using our Lenten sandbox as a tool for contemplation.

Pastor Brendan and I are excited to be on this Lenten journey with you and curious to see what the Spirit might reveal to us in the sand.

May this season draw us all closer to God and God's beloved Child Jesus. And, may we all grow closer to who it is that God calls us to be as unique, beautiful individuals and as the beloved community at BHUMC.






