During our services on the 5th, we will name and light a candle for all those we hold dear who have died in the recent past as well as have a special moment of prayer and reflection. **If you would like someone's name to be read and for a candle to be lit in their honor during this service, please contact Robyn Axon in the church office by Monday, October 23.**

The God we worship is among us always, but we can most clearly feel their holy presence when we are with one another—whether in body or in spirit. May God continue to be with us in our togetherness as we seek to live as true followers of Christ.

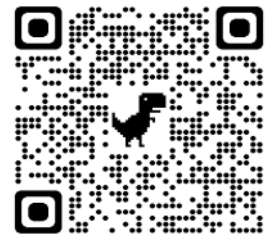

Lord's Acre Fair Summary

We did it again! The Lord's Acre Fair was a smashing success on every level. Despite the wind and rain that caused some problems for our Friday night events, thousands of people experienced all the smells, sounds and loving spirit that our fair brings to the community. All the usual booths were back and in addition we continued to provide great kid entertainment with pony rides, the Reptile Experience, the bounce house and lots of good music, all for free. Although the fair was financially successful, **raising more than \$40,000**, the true success of the fair is found in the fellowship, outreach and the loving and giving spirit that is found in every encounter among our church community and the people coming to the fair.

As always, the fair reached out to many others in our community.

- Backpacks were given to **Schenectady Schools**.
- **Works of Mercy** took bags of children's clothes.
- **Shelters of Saratoga** received clean sleeping bags.
- The **Guardian House and rescue squad volunteers** were given chicken barbecue dinners.
- **Birthright** was given bags of baby clothes, towels and blankets.
- **ECAR (Every Campus Is A Refuge)** received clothing, linens and household goods.
- Luggage went to a **migrant support group**.
- Fabric went to Florida to make **clothing for African children**.
- Winter clothing went to the **Salvation Army Soup Kitchen**
- Books went to **schools, prisons, families and Reading Is Fun**.
- **Northern Rivers Residential Placement** received jeans, sweats, sneakers, jackets and electronics.
- **Local families** received furniture, bedding, toys and clothes.
- **Young Parents United** received furniture, household goods, baby equipment and clothing.

We continued outreach beyond the fair using the town garage sale. We let people take away any thing that we had and they could give a donation to UMCOR in support of Maui Relief. That **part of the fair raised \$1060**. Proceeds from The Lord's Acre Fair will be used to match up to \$5000 that has been raised for support of the people of Maui by our church and community. **We expect to be sending a check for \$10,000 to UMCOR.**
